A RESOLUTION

To commend Louisiana's libraries, librarians, and library staffers and to encourage the celebration of National Library Week, April 10 through 16, 2011.

WHEREAS, first sponsored in 1958, National Library Week is a national observance sponsored by the American Library Association (ALA) and libraries across the country each April; and

WHEREAS, libraries provide free access to everything from books and online resources for families to library business centers that help support entrepreneurship and retraining; and

WHEREAS, today, more than ever, Louisiana's school, academic, public, and special libraries are making a true difference in the lives of the state's citizens; and

WHEREAS, libraries are places of opportunity that provide programs teaching all forms of literacy, promoting continuing education, and encouraging lifelong learning; and

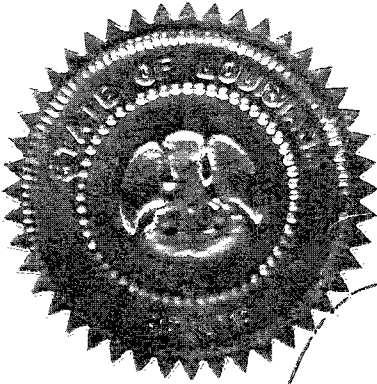
WHEREAS, every day, the people of Louisiana turn to and depend on their libraries and librarians; and
