## Fall 2005 Statewide Conference Update

Planning is underway for the 13<sup>th</sup> Annual LaSSAL Statewide Conference to be held in Baton Rouge this fall. While the roster for the two days is not yet complete, we already have some interesting topics and workshops in the lineup. On Thursday morning, September 22, Karen Vargas from NLM will lead a workshop entitled, "From Snake Oil to Penicillin: Evaluating Consumer Health Information on the Internet." That afternoon, Kevin Hastings-Merriman from McNeese State University will give a workshop entitled "Step, Step, Pivot, Step: Building and Using Excel Pivot Tables to Analyze Data." Both workshops promise to be fascinating, giving participants practical, hands-on training. Then on Friday, September 23, Beth Vandersteen from Rapides Public Library will address the membership on the topic of the importance of library paraprofessionals, a topic you requested. Dean Beth Paskoff from the LSU Library School will give a breakout session on another topic you requested: the scholarships and funding available to paraprofessionals who wish to advance their careers. Benjamin Cornwell from the LSU Office of Disability Services will give a presentation on assisting library patrons who have disabilities. Finally, Maureen Olle from LSU will return and speak on how to find information on government grants. Three more presentations are in the works, and we hope to incorporate more of your suggestions for presentations. Thursday's workshops will be held at the Frey Center on the LSU campus, with plenty of visitor parking directly at the back of the building. Friday's sessions will be held at the Holiday Inn South. Make plans now to attend!

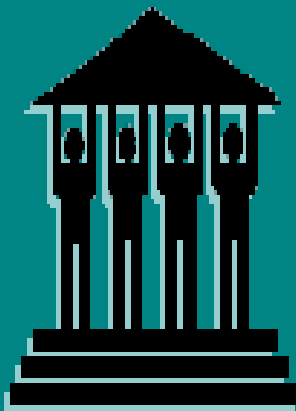
