Pitcher made history in Baton Rouge by becoming the first African American to be elected to judgeships at three different levels of the court system, including both the 19th Judicial District Court and the Louisiana First Circuit Court of Appeal. He is the recipient of numerous honors and awards, including the G. Leon Netterville Award for Outstanding Achievement in Law from Southern University and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Greater New Orleans Louis A. Martinet Legal Society.
